

What is Domestic Violence?

Domestic violence and sexual assault are pervasive, life-threatening crimes affecting millions of individuals across our nation regardless of age, gender, economic status, race, religion, or education level.

More than 1 in 4 women and 1 in
 9 men have experienced severe domestic violence in their lifetime.



Not Someone Else's Problem


- Common in India: 35 % of women have experienced domestic violence at least once
- ► Common in Kerala: 15.3 % of Kerala women have experienced physical violence at the hands of their husbands.
 - Christian Kerala Women 14%
- Common amongst Immigrants to USA: abuse rate range from 30% to 50%
 - Economic, Social, Emotional Abuse



Not Someone Else's Problem

- 1 in 15 children are exposed to intimate partner violence each year, and 90% of these children are eyewitnesses to this violence
- 45% of children have experienced at least one adverse childhood experience (ACE)
- 50% of Asian Indian Emerging Adults in the US (2021) reported
 1 ACE, 26.9% > 3 ACE's.
 - 26.9% Emotional Abuse
 - 24.6% Emotional Neglect
 - ► 19.2% Physical Abuse

Intergenerational Cycle of Violence






Fig. 1. Displaced aggression (courtesy of Kweykw Consulting, Canada).

- Factors that Contribute to Childhood Resilience
 - 1 Positive Stable relationship with a caring adult.
 - Being part of a faith community or a cultural tradition
 - Development of problem solving skills, self regulation skills.

Biblical Importance of the Family

- ► The family is a fundamental institution of human society. Genesis 2:20-25
 - ▶ ²⁰ So the man gave names to all the livestock, the birds in the sky and all the wild animals. But for Adam^[a] no suitable helper was found. ²¹ So the Lord God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs^[b] and then closed up the place with flesh. ²² Then the Lord God made a woman from the rib^[c] he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man.
- ► Marriage is a picture of the relationship of Christ to the church. Ephesians 5: 22-32
 - Wives, submit yourselves to your own husbands as you do to the Lord. ²³ For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Savior. ²⁴ Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything. ²⁵ Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶ to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷ and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. ²⁸ In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. ²⁹ After all, no one ever hated their own body, but they feed and care for their body, just as Christ does the church— ³⁰ for we are members of his body. ³¹ "For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh." ^[2] ³² This is a profound mystery—but I am talking about Christ and the church.

Christian Leadership in the Family

- "Leadership is the act of influencing/serving others out of Christ's interests in their lives so they accomplish God's purposes for and through them" – Bill Lawrence
- Leadership is NOT Lordship
 - Influencing vs Demanding
 - Relationships vs Distance
 - Servanthood vs. Ruling

"You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and those who are great .exercise authority over them. Yet it shall not be so among you; but whoever desires to be come great among you, let him be your servant. And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your slave just as the **Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve**" (Matt. 20:25-28).

Lead with Love: Start with Prayer

Lead with Love: Law of the Farm

- Farmer will have a good harvest only if works diligently over his farm
- Think with the end in mind: what would determine a successful Harvest for your family life?
- Are you sowing the seeds for that today?
- Are you maintaining the farm everyday?



Lead with Love: Keep your marriage healthy

- Love is to recognize the value in the other person.
- Decide on a deep commitment to each other and to the relationship
- Be intentional about cultivating this relationship





Lead with Love: Spend Meaningful Time Together

- Prioritize first things first
- Put the most important things to your life on your schedule first.

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Lead with Love: Communicate with Love

- Listen to understand.
- Communicate appreciation, love, and gratitude
- Gottman Ratio Positives and the Negatives: 5:1

positivity ratio


Lead with love: THINK before you speak

Lead with Love: Lead yourself with love

 - Self awareness What do you believe about yourself. What labels have you held onto?
 - Self Development How can I grow ?
 - Self Care –You are called to be the light, choose to be the flashlight and recharge, not the candle that burns out.
